<p><u>Art</u> Create a piece of artwork based around fire or ice. You could use paint, drawings, sculpture or any other medium you like!</p>	<p><u>Research</u> Find out about an animal that lives in an icy place (perhaps polar bears or arctic foxes!) Write your own diary for at least a week. You could add drawings or stick in things you collect, like tickets or leaflets, or photos too.</p>	<p><u>Weather patterns:</u> Watch and record the winter weather for a week. You might just make notes about what you notice, or perhaps you could use a thermometer or measuring jug to measure the</p>
<p><u>Significant people</u> Sir Christopher Wren was a famous architect who helped to redesign London after the Great Fire of London. Design or build your own model building inspired by Sir Christopher Wren. Try to include a dome, tower or strong walls.</p>	<p><u>Talk at home: Fire safety</u> In 1666, fire caused huge damage to homes. How can we keep our own houses safe from fire? Walk around your house with a parent or carer. Can you spot things that could be dangerous? What do we need to do to keep safe? (eg. <i>use oven gloves, turn off electrical items</i>).
